

Small Business Energy Efficiency Grants

The Small Business Energy Efficiency Grants Program will help businesses save money by reducing energy consumption and enhance their competitive position as Pennsylvania's electricity market transitions to market pricing.

This is the first program available through the Alternative Energy Investment Fund, a key part of Pennsylvania's Energy Independence. The \$650 million Alternative Energy Investment Fund includes \$237 million targeted specifically toward helping small businesses and families conserve electricity and manage higher energy prices.

The small business community is critical to Pennsylvania's economic health and vitality. Well-designed energy efficiency projects can help small businesses operate more efficiently and save money while simultaneously improving Pennsylvania's environment.

The Small Business Energy Efficiency Grants will apply to energy efficiency improvements on systems such as lighting, heating, cooling, refrigeration and process machinery, as well as building insulation and weatherization improvement projects.

An eligible applicant must be an independent for-profit small business with 100 employees or fewer whose business or facility is located within Pennsylvania. Examples of eligible small businesses include manufacturers, retailers, service providers, mining businesses and agricultural operations.

Qualifying projects must have an annual energy savings of at least 20 percent for the system being replaced or 20 percent savings for the entire business's energy consumption. The project must also save the business at least \$1,000 a year in energy costs. The grants will provide up to 25 percent of project costs for equipment and installation, with a maximum grant of \$25,000.

Applications for this funding will be accepted through May 1, 2009, with \$3 million available to help small businesses use energy wisely. Applications and guidelines are available at www.depweb.state.pa.us, keyword: Small Business Energy Efficiency Grants.
