#### **Introduction**

This annual report covers the operations of the Pennsylvania Energy Development Authority (PEDA) for the period July 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013. This year saw the awarding of one energy project totaling \$114,551.00. PEDA also monitored progress and implementation of existing grant projects. A listing of these projects is provided in Appendix A.

## **Background**

PEDA was created by the Energy Development Authority and Emergency Powers Act of 1982. PEDA is a public corporation governed by a 19-member Board of Directors and managed by an Executive Director and staff. PEDA became active when its first Board of Directors was confirmed on June 26, 1984, and it remained active until 1995. After a period of dormancy, on April 8, 2004, an Executive Order 2004-5 was issued revitalizing PEDA and transferring to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), which now provides staffing authority for PEDA.

PEDA's mission is to promote the development and use of Pennsylvania's clean, indigenous energy resources and to stimulate economic development and job creation in Pennsylvania's growing energy sector in an environmentally beneficial manner.

#### Accomplishments in the 2012-13 Fiscal Year

PEDA received an application from Northumberland County for the repowering of their county courthouse from an oil fired boiler to a natural gas boiler with energy efficiency controls. This project proposed to utilize Growing Greener II funds which were previously awarded to Northumberland County in 2008, for the Intelliwatt Project. The Intelliwatt project was closed in the spring of 2012, due to lack of progress without expending any funds. Northumberland County submitted a request for a re-designation for those funds for the energy efficiency project.

PEDA held a board meeting on June 19, 2013. At this board meeting, PEDA approved the Northumberland County Project for a grant award in the amount of \$114,551.00. PEDA also appointed, via vote, DEP Acting Secretary E. Christopher Abruzzo as Acting Chairman of PEDA replacing the previous Acting Chairman, Secretary Michael Krancer. A new Acting Executive Director of PEDA, David Althoff Jr., was introduced to the PEDA board. The previous Executive Director, Mr. Thomas Bell, had left the employ of DEP and PEDA in June of 2012. The PEDA board ratified having Mr. Althoff serve as the Acting Executive Director of PEDA until further notice.

## Financial Report

As of June 30, 2013, the Energy Development Fund maintained a balance of \$4,741,968.31. The funds include designated administrative funds, revenue from interest on securities, Duquesne Light settlement funds and the repayment of loan principal and interest from one remaining loan to Community Energy, Inc. The loan is due to be paid in full by February 2016. Financial information for the Energy Development Fund is

described in the Fund Balance sheet, attached as Appendix B, the Unreserved Fund Balance Sheet, attached as Appendix C, and the Duquesne Light Settlement funds as described in Appendix D.

Growing Greener II had provided PEDA with up to \$10 million annually for five years ending in FY 2009-10. Those funds are a part of the Commonwealth's general obligation bond issuances. As such, the funds are not deposited directly into the Energy Development Fund, but are maintained by the Governor's Office of Budget as a part of the larger fund containing other general obligation bond proceeds. PEDA grantees utilizing Growing Greener II monies are paid from this larger fund. A statement of commitments and expenditures for PEDA's allocation of Growing Greener II funding is attached as Appendix E. An uncommitted balance exists in this fund of \$7,725,332.48. This fund has increased by over \$3 million during this reporting year due to the claw back of funding from projects that did not fully expend the awarded grant amount or projects which returned funding to PEDA due to non-performance.

## **Activities Going Forward**

PEDA will continue to manage existing grants and returned funding from unspent grant funds in anticipation of a future funding solicitation. With the expiration of many of the appointed PEDA board members, the goal of the Board will be to have the full board in place, nominated by the Governor, confirmed by the Senate and a Governor appointed Chair Person in the upcoming year.

The Board will be planning to utilize a newly developed 2013 Pennsylvania State Energy Plan as a foundation to updating the 2008 PEDA Energy Development Plan. The Energy Development plan would be a new starting point for any policies and program that the board would take forward to utilize the funds available to PEDA.

## Conclusion

PEDA continues to work with Governor Tom Corbett, the legislature and the private sector to help finance innovative clean energy projects and companies and to promote clean energy in Pennsylvania. In the coming year, PEDA's board and staff look forward to continuing work to foster growth in this exciting area of the economy.
