Dear Mr. Beard:

B.P. Products North America Inc. (BP) requests the addition of three sites to the Multi-Site Agreement (MSA). The basis for the addition of these three sites is provided below.

BP Site No. 01975, DEP Facility ID No. Unassigned

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has indicated that they wish to terminate their Consent Order for this site and transfer it into the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) Multi-Site Agreement (MSA) after site characterization is completed. The MSA requires having a Remedy in Place (RIP) by the end of 2008. Based upon the amount of work already completed at the site, this schedule should not be problematic.

BP Site No. 07289, DEP Facility ID No. 02-26613

Early in 2006, analytical results from an environmental assessment performed by a consultant on behalf of Wexford Plaza revealed methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) groundwater concentrations above Act 2 Statewide Health Standard (SWHS) Medium-Specific Concentrations (MSC). Following the installation of three onsite monitoring wells, BP confirmed that groundwater samples exceeded the SWHS MSC for MTBE. BP requests that this site be added to the MSA Site Inventory since the site was a new release in 2006.

BP Site No. 57408, DEP Facility ID No. 65-14174


During February, 2006 URS Corporation (URS) performed a complete closure of the underground storage tank (UST) system. During the UST removal activities, impacted soil was observed in the product line trenches and beneath the product dispensers. A reportable release was confirmed on February 7, 2006. BP requests that this site be added to the MSA Site Inventory since the site was a new release in 2006.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING ADDITIONAL SITES

Modifications to Site Inventory

Dated: April 20, 2007

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and BP Products North America Inc. (successor by merger to BP Exploration & Oil Inc.) and Amoco Oil Company (now known as BP Products North America Inc.) ("BP") previously entered into a Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement on or about March 14, 2001. Pursuant to Section V.B.2. of the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement, including but not limited to subsections a, b, n, o and p, the Oversight Committee, comprised of representatives of BP and the Department, has the authority to add additional sites to the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement. As more fully described below, the Oversight Committee agrees to add 3 sites listed in the attached Table 1 to the Site Inventory (Attachment 1 to the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement) and to treat the sites in Table 1 as Original Sites. This memorandum of understanding does not constitute a modification of the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement.

1. Additional Sites
 - A. Upon signing of the MOU by all Oversight Committee members, the sites listed in Table 1 shall be added to the Site Inventory (Attachment 1 to the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement).
 - B. Except as provided below, the list of additional sites in Table 1 shall be treated as "Original Sites", as that term is defined in the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement.
 - i. Within 30 days of the approval of this Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Additional Sites by the Oversight Committee the following actions will be completed.
 - a. The Site Inventory shall be updated to include the list of sites in Table 1;
 - b. The Site Categorization process contained in Section III.A of the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement shall be applied to the list of sites in Table 1.
 - ii. The sites in Table 1 will be included in the 2008 Master Plan. The Master Plan will be developed in accordance with Section III.B of the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement.
 - iii. For purposes of the Remedy-in-Place targets established under Section V.A.1 of the Cooperative Multi-Site Agreement, the new sites listed in Table 1 shall not be considered Original Sites until January 1, 2008, it being the specific intent of the Department and BP that the additional sites shall not be used to evaluate BP's compliance with the Remedy in Place target for December 31, 2007.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING ADDITIONAL SITES

This Memorandum of Understanding is agreed to by the Oversight Committee effective April 20, 2007.






