BUREAU OF MINE SAFETY ANNOUNCES ANTHRACITE MINE FOREMAN, ASSISTANT MINE FOREMAN AND MINE EXAMINER EXAMINATIONS

The Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Mine Safety, will hold **examinations** for Anthracite Mine Foreman, Assistant Mine Foreman, and Mine Examiner Certificates on **October 26, 2018,** at DEP, Bureau of Mine Safety, First Floor Conference Room, 5 West Laurel Boulevard, Pottsville, Pa.

Please have the application *COMPLETED*, *NOTARIZED* and return to DEP, Bureau of Mine Safety office as soon as possible but no later than **October 12, 2018**. An exam/certification fee of \$50.00 in the form of a check or money order payable to "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania" shall accompany the application. The application will be reviewed for eligibility to qualify for the examination.

To apply for Anthracite Mine Foreman certification, you must be at least 25 years of age and have satisfactory evidence of at least **five years' practical experience as a miner**, and of good conduct, capability and sobriety. Miners will be required to demonstrate their knowledge of anthracite mining techniques as well as demonstrate the use of mine gas detection equipment.

The one-day examination consists of one session beginning at 8:00 a.m. A practical examination will be given prior to the written examination. This practical examination will be pass or fail. If you fail the practical examination, you are not eligible for the written examination.

A **training session** to prepare for this examination will be held on **October 18, 2018,** 8:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., at the Tremont Mine Rescue Station, 44 N. Crescent St. Tremont, Pa.
