

NPDES Construction Stormwater (PAG-02) Permit Highlights and Changes

Length of the permit

Changing from a two year permit term to a five year permit term



Fees

- Base fee has not changed \$500
- Includes a disturbed acreage fee \$100 per disturbed acre
- Fees set by revised Chapter 102 regulations enacted on November 19, 2010



Eligibility for permit coverage

- Earth disturbance activities equal to or greater than 1 acre (with few exceptions)
- List of activities that are not eligible for coverage (15 items)



Changes in eligibility for permit coverage

- Impaired waters
- Waters with a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL)
- Discharges to MS4 and CSO systems



Insufficient Funds

 Addresses the situation in which permits have been authorized without sufficient funds



Long-term Obligations

- Added new obligations required by the revised Chapter 102 revisions
 - Final certification by licensed professional
 - Deeding restrictions
 - Record drawings
- Requirements on recording deeds before sale of lots



Non-compliance reporting

 Changed to clarify when the Department must be notified



Restoration plans

- Can be used in lieu of post construction stormwater management (PCSM) plans
- Must contain a baseline set of items identified in 102.8(n)



Stabilization

 Temporary stabilization required within 4 days



Voluntary forest buffers

 Provides for the antidegradation presumption for areas that establish, protect or convert a riparian forest buffer



MS4 minimum control measures

 MS4s can rely on the NPDES construction stormwater program for implementation of MCM 4 and part of MCM 5



Public Notice for Offsetting

 30-day public notice of all PAG-02 permits involving a stormwater offset
