This is a letter of support for the Eastern Pennsylvania Coalition for Abandoned Mine Reclamation's (EPCAMR) proposal under OSM's Applied Sciences Grant. The Citizens Advisory Council¹ has a long history of working on reclamation and mine drainage remediation issues, including election of four of our members to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's Mining and Reclamation Advisory Board.

Pennsylvania's coal mining heritage has resulted in a legacy of mine scarred lands and water supplies. In order to try to turn these environmental liabilities into opportunities, we need the ability to determine the availability and quality of mine pool water.
