
discussing environmental justice (EJ) issues regarding Erie Coke in June of 2016 with EJAB member and Urban Erie CDC Executive Director Gary Horton and other stakeholders. In August of

2017, DEP received a Title V permit renewal application from Erie Coke. The renewal application sparked enhanced public participation around the permit application and Erie Coke operations. Because of the feedback from the community on Erie Coke's application, DEP began to facilitate the development of a stakeholder group interested and engaged in environmental issues in Erie, specifically Erie Coke. The group, included Gary Horton of the Urban Erie Community Development Corporation, representatives of the Benedictine Sisters, the Sierra Club, representatives from the City of Erie, elected officials, and others. The group first met in October of 2017 with 20-24 individuals and quickly grew. DEP has utilized several engagement tools to advance community involvement. DEP utilized
