Re: Act 17 - Wilkes-Barre Area School District - Proposed High School (Pagnotti) Site

Dear Mr. Scheller:

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has completed an Act 17 substrata evaluation for the Wilkes-Barre Area School District's proposed new high school construction at the Pagnotti Site, Plains Township, Luzerne County.

The core drilling program within the proposed construction site concentrated on the Hillman, Upper Five Foot and Lower Five Foot Veins. Our site evaluation indicates that the maximum coal mining related subsidence risk for this site is medium. Generally, there is a low risk for pothole type subsidence; however past surface mining on the site may contribute to future settlement due to unconsolidated soil/spoil material. The calculated maximum for trough type subsidence for this site from the Upper Five Foot and Lower Five Foot Veins is 1.0 feet of vertical displacement (Test Borings Nos. B5 & B6). Additional uncalculated broad, shallow trough type settlement from deeper mine workings in the Upper Baltimore and Lower Baltimore Veins (not drilled for this evaluation) is also a possibility. A maximum subsidence event at this site could cause structural damage and pose some risk to the health and safety of building occupants.

The Department grants you a conditional approval to construct the proposed facility if the Wilkes-Barre Area School District implements, as a minimum, a site preparation or foundation reinforcement program designed and approved by a qualified foundation engineer. This conditional approval allows you to consider a variety of options to modify the site or strengthen the proposed building foundation beyond that which is commonly designed for a facility not threatened by subsidence of the indicated magnitude.
