The Department of Environmental Protection ("Department") is the agency with the authority to administer and enforce the Clean Streams Law, the Act of June 22, 1937, P.L. 1987, as amended, 35 P.S. §691.1 *et seq.*, and Section 1917-A of the Administrative Code, the Act of April 9, 1929, P.L. 177 as amended, 71 P.S. §510-17, and the Rules and Regulations of the Environmental Quality Board adopted thereunder

The undersigned authorized representative of the Department has conducted an inspection of the above project on the above date and has determined that violations listed in this Compliance Order ("Order") exist. This Order constitutes a separate Order for each violation listed.

Pursuant to Sections 5, 316, 402, and 610 of the Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§691.5, 691.316, 691.402, and 691.610) and Section 1917-A of the Administrative Code, as amended, 71 P.S. §510-17, the Department hereby ORDERS that the person shall perform the remedial actions listed in this Order.

Failure to comply with this Order constitutes unlawful conduct under Section 611 of the Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §691.611). Section 605 of the Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §691.605) provides that the Department may assess a civil penalty of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) per day for each violation of this Order.

Nothing contained in this Order shall be construed to relieve or limit the obligations of the above-mentioned person to comply with the terms and conditions of any permit existing or hereafter issued by the Department to this person, or to limit any civil or criminal liability of this person. Additional requirements may be imposed in the future by subsequent Department Orders or other actions. Your prompt compliance with this Order will be considered when assessing a civil penalty for the violation(s) which is (are) the subject of this Order.

APPEAL NOTICE

Any person aggrieved by this action may appeal, pursuant to Section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act, 35 P.S. Section 7514, and the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa. C.S. Chapter 5A, to the Environmental Hearing Board, Second Floor, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, P.O. Box 8457, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8457, (717) 787-3483. TDD users may contact the Board through the Pennsylvania Relay Service, (800) 654-5984. Appeals must be filed with the Environmental Hearing Board within 30 days of receipt of written notice of this action unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in braille or on audiotape from the Secretary to the Board at (717)787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

YOU DO NOT NEED A LAWYER TO FILE AN APPEAL WITH THE BOARD; HOWEVER, BECAUSE IMPORTANT LEGAL RIGHTS ARE AT STAKE, YOU SHOULD SHOW THIS DOCUMENT TO A LAWYER AT ONCE. Begin implementing and/or maintaining the following best management practice(s) at the site in order to minimize the potential for accelerated erosion and sedimentation and control post construction stormwater:

Immediately cease all sediment pollution to water(s) of the Commonwealth.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §102.11(a)(1), Equitrans Midstream ("ETRN" or "Permittee") shall design, implement, and install E&S BMPs at the George L Reade 1 Well Site and Access Roads. Because Permittee failed to properly implement and maintain E&S BMPs during earth disturbance activities associated with site spill remediation, accelerated erosion and sedimentation occurred resulting in pollution and potential pollution to Waters of the Commonwealth ("WOTC"). Specifically, temporary E&S BMPs are incorrectly implemented and/or maintained by the Permittee, resulting in pollution and potential pollution to roadside ditches and a conveyance channel.

Therefore, Permittee shall immediately cease all earth disturbance activities, other than those necessary to properly repair and maintain existing BMPs and temporarily stabilize disturbed areas in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §102.11(a)(1). Such BMPs shall be adequate to ensure the maintenance and protection of water quality and existing designated uses.

On or before December 12, Permittee shall submit an Erosion and Sediment Control Plan ("ESC Plan") to the Department in writing that fully complies with rules and regulations of the Department that will among other requirements, minimize the potential for accelerated erosion and sedimentation and potential pollution to waters of the Commonwealth based upon existing project conditions. The ESC Plan shall identify E&S BMPs to ensure the maintenance and protection of water quality and existing designated uses based upon existing project conditions, including areas affected by the Site and Access Roads where existing BMPs have failed or are inadequate or where there is pollution from sediment and potential pollution as well as degradation and/or encroachment of aquatic resources. This ESC Plan shall also include, but not be limited to, information necessary to adequately review the ESC Plan and a description of how the operator shall maintain topsoil and subsoil during earth disturbance to prevent sediment from entering watercourses and bodies of water. The Erosion and Sediment Control Plan shall also identify all existing and receiving watercourses and bodies of water and their current conditions, which includes the location of all surface waters of this Commonwealth which may receive runoff within or from the project site, including all streams, rivers, lakes, reservoirs, ponds, seeps, springs, estuaries, and wetlands in accordance with the requirements of 25 Pa. Code §102.4(b)(5), including but not limited to possible wetlands near 40.41272, -78.94214 and 40.41208, -78.94361.

On or before December 12, 2022, for any disturbed area upon temporary cessation of an earth disturbance activity or any state or phase of an activity where cessation of earth disturbance activities will exceed four (4) days, Permittee shall temporarily stabilize the area(s) pursuant to 25 Pa. Code § 102.22(b) and the rules and regulations of the Department, including but not limited to immediately seeding and mulching such disturbed area(s), or otherwise protecting such area(s) from accelerated erosion and sedimentation pending future earth disturbance activities. For an earth disturbance activity or any state or phase of an activity to be considered temporarily stabilized, the disturbed areas shall be covered with either a minimum uniform coverage of mulch and seed with a density capable of resisting accelerated erosion and sedimentation or an acceptable BMP which temporarily minimizes accelerated erosion and sedimentation and include the proper placing, grading, constructing, reinforcing, lining, and covering of soil, rock or earth to ensure their resistance to erosion, sliding or other movement. Permittee shall implement and maintain all Erosion and Sedimentation Best Management Practices E&S BMPs until permanent stabilization is completed.
