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## PROCEEDINGS

MS. FRALEY: We're here to review testimony on DEP's prompt interim response under the Hazardous Sites Cleanup Program or HSCA to the Beaver Alkali Products Pool Doctor site in Rochester, Beaver County.

This hearing is held in conjunction with an open comment period on the administrative record.

DEP welcomes feedback on its decision to pursue a HSCA response, as well as any information the public may have about this site.

In order to accommodate the greatest number of residents interested in speaking, limit your testimony to five minutes. If, for some reason, we get through everyone and you want to add something else, in this instance, we will allow additional time for you if you have already registered and if everyone else has spoken. You will get an additional five minutes.

I will call out your name in the order that you registered to come up to the microphone and provide testimony. I will also announce the next person in line so that they can sort of mentally

prepare themselves.

When it's your turn, please clearly state your name and address. You have five minutes to provide that testimony. You can do so at the microphone here.

We still ask that you kind of come up here just so our stenographer can, like, fully hear you and see what you're saying.

When you're down to about one minute left, I will say one minute. And we ask that no one in the audience interrupt our testifiers so that they can have every opportunity to say what they need to say.

If you go over your time, I'll be a little bit more assertive, and if you have some written testimony that you'd like to provide, you can drop that in this public comments box following your remarks. If not, you can always provide that to us at a later date, or we're receiving it here so that's sufficient.

And just to reiterate, if you ask a question or phrase your comment in a way that implies that you're expecting a response, we will not give you a verbal response during this hearing.

Rather, responses will be formulated after the

hearing in the form of a comment response document that will be provided to you if you signed in, you registered and we will provide that to you and likely put that on our website as well.

We've got more basic ground rules and - just really want to stick to. Please be respectful to people who are here, to listen and to speak. If someone is up here speaking, don't talk over them and, you know, if you have to take a cell phone call, do it outside. Basic stuff like that.

So we're going to start with our first registered testifier. That's Conrad Bianco, and then Gene Zuff is next. I don't see him here, but we'll check and see if anyone else has come in. So, Conrad, you're up.

MR. BIANCO: Conrad Bianco on behalf of The Cellar Dwellers, the renters of the first floor space of the Beaver Valley Bowl, which I guess is next door to where you guys were firefighting. I guess I got five minutes.

The Cellar Dwellers have been performing on the third floor for over 10 years.

They have costumes, set pieces, as well as studio equipment, on the third floor rental space that we would like to get access to because we don't know if

we're allowed back in there. And then our systems.

I came down to the site the night of the fire, was

told to leave by a fire medic. Next week, I saw 
actually, it was two weeks after that I saw on

Facebook the Beaver Valley Bowl was closed. No

reason was given for the closure. I spoke with DEP

crew on site.

They informed me the building was able to be occupied. We had a show on the 9th, on the 9th of August 2019.

The next week one of our members got a call from Brenda, a worker at the Beaver Valley

Bowl, and she informed us we are not allowed on the site.

I then called DEP and, again, got confirmation the building was not on the list of off-limits areas. However, local government may have put the building off limits.

So we don't know anything about - and then, I guess my final questions are, I guess - which I know you're not going to answer me, who closed the site and how was it relayed? Because it seems like some people got the information that we're closing the site. Some people didn't get that message. It went back and forth. I mean, I was on

the site itself. I said, hey, is this place open? People said, yes, it's open. You can go in there. Matter of fact, even the night of the fire, I asked can I go into the building and get things? And the crew there said, yeah, you can go in and go. fire is on this building. I said, okay, that's great. And I'm not even too sure now if I'm allowed in there or not, so I think that's all I got. you.

## MS. FRALEY: Thank you.

Just I guess a quick aside, if you have a moment, I think we can give you the best of our information but we'll still give you a formal response afterwards so if you maybe want to stick around?

MR. BIANCO: No problem. Thank you.

 $\underline{\text{MS. FRALEY:}} \quad \text{Next up is Gene Zuff.} \quad \text{I}$  think he has left.

And then you, yeah, come up. Just make sure you say your first and last name so we can make sure we have that.

MR. MUITER: My name is Greg Muiter spelled M-U-I-T-E-R. 694 Fourth Street, and that's in downtown Beaver. I was impacted on July 13, the morning of the second ignition.

Unfortunately, I was in an open-top vehicle at the time, and I was driving on Route 65 south. And I came to that plume that had just reignited, so it was --- to say it was thick was an understatement. It was so thick that I couldn't see my hands on the steering wheel. And, again, the vehicle was an open top. Think of, like, a Jeep.

So within - really, within minutes, even seconds, I felt the impacts of the chlorine exposure. My question which I know can't be answered at this time, is the bromine and what type of bromine was it? Because a quick search after I just learned there was bromine in that smoke, you know, there's different types of bromine so I'd be curious to know the answer to that if that could be relayed to me, please?

But within minutes of that exposure, I was shaking, convulsing. My fingertips were numb from my tips up to my elbows. My legs were shaking uncontrollably. My eyes were watering. I had to pull over, and I called 911. 911 was probably being overwhelmed with calls at the moment. They were very short with me, and when I told them I didn't feel well, they actually basically hung up on me.

So I continued on down the highway and

when I got to my destination, which was Sewickley I collapsed out of my car to which 911 was called and I was taken to Mercy Hospital.

So I just wanted to go on record as to that was what happened. That's the very short version. I'm truncating a lot of the effects that happened to me afterwards and then I continue to feel.

So thank you.

MS. FRALEY: I think that's everyone we have on our list of testifiers this evening.

Given that there are no additional comments from the public, we will conclude our hearing.

We will note for the record that representatives of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection were present to hold this hearing.

As I said before, DEP will prepare a comment response document from the testimony tonight and we'll make a copy of that available as soon as it is prepared.

Public comments, questions and statements will be accepted until October 18, 2019. If you wish to submit them between now and then,

please use your fact sheet, the information sheet that you have to reference how to submit those. We thank you for being here. We thank you for your public involvement tonight. Thank you for providing the testimony because as we said before, it's that feedback, both from an anonymous complaint that we received and then your feedback today that is really helpful for us to do our work.

And so we do appreciate your interest in this issue. So have a safe trip home and good evening. As we go off the record, we will stick around for a little bit if you want to ask us any other questions. Thank you.
