Descriptions

Chapter 121/127 Admin. Amendments

This proposed rulemaking would update administrative provisions in the Department's air pollution control regulations. The regulations include definitions for terms that apply to the air resources management program (Chapter 121) and the permitting and operating plan requirements for air pollution sources in Pennsylvania (Chapter 127).

Delegation of Authority


This proposed rulemaking would amend Chapter 122 and would provide the express legal authority for the Department of to request delegation from the EPA to implement and enforce the requirements of an applicable Federal Plan for existing sources (that is, controls for emissions of an air pollutant) established by the EPA under 40 CFR Part 62.

RACTIII Corrections

This final-form rulemaking amends the RACT 3 regulation to correct errors in the mass-equivalent basis factors specified in the optional alternative compliance demonstration method established in § 129.115(c)(2)—(4) and also corrects a cross-reference error in § 129.115(d).







Milestones

Redesignation of Beaver County 2010 1-Hr. SO2 NAAQS

EPA is proposing to approve the SIP revision and redesignation request submitted on August 2024 to redesignate the Beaver County, PA area from nonattainment to attainment for the 2010 1-hour primary SO2 NAAQS and maintenance plan. Comment period closed August 25, 2025

Liberty-Clairton Maintenance Designation

On July 24, 2025, EPA announced approval to designate Liberty-Clarition as a maintenance area for the 2012 annual PM2.5 NAAQS.
