ROAD SUBSIDENCE ABANDONED MINE RECLAMATION PROJECT

Office of Active and Abandoned Mine Operations

Purpose →

To eliminate eligible abandoned mine public health and safety hazards that were located near a residence.

A metal pipe was installed under the OSM 40(2138)102.1 Curry Hill/ Avondale project to convey drainage through the 130 Sickler Hill Road property, Plymouth Township, Luzerne County. The pipe is approximately 200 feet in length and conveys runoff beneath the side yard, the paved driveway, and the main yard to an established channel. The bottom of the pipe was severely rusted, and two sections of the pipe were separated beneath the edge of the paved driveway and main yard. These separated sections caused material to collapse into the pipe, forming a subsidence on the driveway. In addition, the main yard had settled above the pipe.

The project work consisted of mobilizing equipment, installing erosion and sedimentation controls, site preparation, diversion and care of water, drainage excavation, sliplining a new 54-inch diameter smooth interior snap-tite pipe into the existing damaged 72-inch diameter corrugated metal pipe, filling and sealing the space between the two pipes, backfilling, sawcutting and paving portions of asphalt driveway, seeding, and demobilizing equipment. The project area was cleaned up at the completion of the project.

Accomplishments for this project include the reclamation of Abandoned Mine Land Feature (AMLF) No. 2138–21, classified as a Priority 1 Clogged Stream (CS) feature, which subsequently restored the conveyance of drainage through the property for a length of 0.1 miles.



Project at a Glance

Location:

The project is located in Plymouth Township, Luzerne County. Take Interstate 81 to Exit 164 for PA-29 N toward US-11/Nanticoke. Continue onto PA-29 N for 4.7 miles. Exit right onto US-11 N towards Plymouth. Continue along US-11 N for approximately 1 mile and turn left onto Sickler Hill Road. The project site is at the top of Sickler Hill Road.
