Overview of Noncoal Bond Forfeitures

Forfeiture Rec Status Update

- Identified the Industrial Mineral sites that have been forfeited and have RECRQ or PPEND as the forfeiture status
- Distributed the list to the inspection staff in each DMO
- Asked the staff to visit each site and determine it reclamation was still required
- If reclamation was required:
 - Is there possibility of continued mining?
 - Using the most recent Bond Rate Guidelines, determine the current liability of the site.
- If no reclamation was required:
 - Was the site reclaimed?
 - Was the site re-permitted?




