For purposes of this section, operation and maintenance includes recapitalization costs.



ABS Project Funding Strategy


- SMCRA Account (48%)
 - ABS Treatment Construction (>\$2 M pending)
- Reclamation Fee O & M Account (42%)
 - O & M Contracts/Grants
 - DEP Direct Costs (Sampling and O & M)
- Released Bond Account (8%)
 - ABS Treatment Design (>\$300,000 pending)



ABS Project Other Funds Sources

- Growing Greener
- OSM Title V
 - Required Inspections
 - Federal Civil Penalties





Civil Penalty Transfer Options

- Retain in the SMCRA Fund
 - Funds available for other SMCRA obligations
 - ABS Construction costs (>\$2 M)
- Transfer all or part directly to ABS Legacy Sites Trust Account
 - Progress toward self-sustaining ABS



Civil Penalty Transfer Options

- Transfer total remaining amount to Rec Fee O & M account as previously recommended
 - Relief from Reclamation Fee for several years
 - Does this impact an alternate funding source?
- Transfer some to Rec Fee O & M Account and some to the ABS Legacy Sites Trust Account
 - Provides immediate relief from the Reclamation
 Fee payments
 - Progress toward a self-sustaining ABS
