

## Mine 78 Surface No. 3 Mine




Project Boundary

## **3. AGENCY COMMENTS**

Information Request: The clearing of forests, woodlots and trees may adversely affect Indiana bats by killing, injuring or harassing roosting bats, and by removing or reducing the quality of foraging and roosting habitat. In accordance with the Endangered Species Act consultation guidelines governing the Office of Surface Mining, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, and coal mining permit applicants, two options are available to address the anticipated effects of projects that will impact 40 or more acres of forests, woodlots and trees (potential summer habitat): survey for the presence of Indiana bats (Option 1), or assume they are present (Option 2). ## 4. DEP INFORMATION
