Dear Ms. Carson:

As requested, I have reviewed provided information related to the proposed Sunoco Pennsylvania Pipeline Project as it pertains to the project area within Robeson Township, Berks County, PA. This pertains to the project route between Stations 14033+50 and 14056+30. Information submitted includes a *Site Restoration and Post-Construction Stormwater Management Plan*, and a partial set of plans titled *Pennsylvania Pipeline Project Construction Spread 5*. Based upon my review of the information provided, I provide the following relative to Floodplain Management and Stormwater Management Ordinance consistency.

Floodplain Management


Plan sheet ES-1.54 indicates a "100 Year Floodway" which appears to be 100 feet wide and straddling the proposed project area near pipeline station 14045+50. This representation appears to be a blanket 50' from drainage path centerline plotting without coordination with the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps. Based upon my review of the applicable FIRM, there is no FEMA mapped floodplain or floodway at that location or anywhere along the project route within Robeson Township. Accordingly, the proposed design is considered to be consistent with the prevailing Floodplain Management Ordinance.

Stormwater Management

The project description and the plan details provided indicate that there will be no newly created impervious surfaces with Robeson Township and further that all areas of disturbance will be restored to their present 'Meadow' condition. Based upon that representation, the proposed design is consistent with the current Robeson Township Stormwater Management Ordinance.
