Winter Period Application of Manure Notification

Agricultural Advisory Board April 16, 2014

Background:

- On March 23, 2013 DEP published the final, renewed NPDES General Permit for CAFOs (PAG-12) in the PA Bulletin
- PAG-12 revised and replaced the prior general permit which expired March 31, 2013
- The renewed PAG-12 included provision for permittee to notify DEP within 7 days prior to land application of manure during "winter"



"Winter" defined in 25 Pa. Code Section 83.201

- December 15 through February 28; or
- Anytime ground frozen at least 4" deep; or
- Anytime that the ground is snow covered



Notification Purpose:

- EPA requested notification provision
- Certification that storage/spreading done consistent with approved nutrient management plan
- Collect general information on frequency and locations
- Provide DEP opportunity to observe application

CAFO/NPDES Individual Permits issued after March 31, 2013 also include winter spreading notification provision.

a.	Consistent with the approved NMP, actions have been taken to maximize the available capacity in the nanure storage facility prior to the winter period to prevent pollution of ground and surface water;
b.	The storage has been properly operated and maintained; and
C.	Manure spread during the winter shall be applied in an amount and a manner consistent with the approved NMP.

In some instances, multiple forms were received from a single CAFO due to multiple applications or a change of application dates from their original submittal

CAFO had option to submit form via mail, fax, or email. Most were sent via fax. Anticipate that three options will remain available.

Inaugural one-page form instructions will likely be revised to clarify some questions DEP received regarding notifications for daily haul and manure import/export situations.
