MS4 Program

- Most Pollutant Reduction Plans and Total Maximum Daily Load Plans were submitted to Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) in September 2017
- These plans generally identify Best
 Management Practices (BMPs) that will be
 implemented over five years to achieve a 10%
 sediment load reduction
- Over 90% have been reviewed and approved



MS4 Program

- Many MS4s collaborated in developing their plans
- The most popular BMP chosen by MS4s has been stream restoration projects
- DEP is currently considering what the next round of permits will require



Chapter 102

- PAG-02 General Permit was reissued in December 2019
- New required use of DEP's PCSM
 Spreadsheet for water quality
- New recognition of evapotranspiration credits for vegetated BMPs
- New use of BMP outflow pollutant concentrations instead of percent removal



Chapter 102

- PAG-01 General Permit possibly issued this spring
- Applies to earth disturbance less than five acres (not in special protection watersheds)
- Prescribed BMPs (no stormwater analysis)
- Incentive for county having a current and approved Act 167 Plan (expedited review period)



PCSM Manual

- Work to update 2006 Stormwater BMP Manual began in October 2017
- A preliminary draft was completed, reviewed by internal DEP/County Conservation District staff and transportation agencies
- Possible publication as a draft technical guidance document for public comment later in 2021



PCSM Manual

- Three options for stormwater analysis: 1)
 design storm, 2) continuous simulation, and 3)
 water balance
- Climate change considered through use of an upper confidence interval of historical data
- Focus is on resilience of BMPs (protection from larger storms)
