Overview of Section 309

- Refers to Section 309 of the federal Coastal Zone Management Act
- Offers additional funding for coastal states to enhance their programs in one or more of nine specific enhancement areas
- Enhancement areas are selected by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)



Nine Enhancement Areas

- Wetlands
- Public Access
- Cumulative and Secondary Impacts
- Ocean and Great Lakes Resources
- Energy and Government Facility Siting

- Coastal Hazards
- Marine Debris
- Special Area Management Planning
- Aquaculture



Overview of Section 309

- Section 309 enhancement grant operates on a five-year cycle
- Currently seeking input for the October 1, 2021, to September 30, 2026, Strategy
- Draft Assessment and Strategy due to NOAA May 1, 2020
- Concurrent 30-day public comment period



CRM's Current Section 309 Strategy

- Building Capacity to Facilitate Climate Adaptation Planning and Community Resiliency
- Analysis of Delaware Estuary Coastal Zone Boundary Expansion



Area of National Importance

- NOAA has designated Coastal Hazards as an "enhancement area of national importance"
 - Coastal programs are "strongly encouraged" to develop strategies to improve the effectiveness of their program
 - Focus of Project of Special Merit Funding
 - Current focus resiliency planning
 - Aligns with National CZM Program's strategic plan



CZM Projects of Special Merit

- Must be supportive of an approved strategy
- Annual federal funding opportunity
 - Usually issued in late fall, due in January
 - Competitive with other coastal programs
 - FY2017, FY2018 and FY2019 (each year):
 - \$1,500,000 total
 - Max \$250,000 Minimum \$50,000
 - 15 awards expected



Program Changes

- A change to coastal zone boundaries
- New or revised authorities
 - Statutes, regulations, enforceable policies, administrative decisions, executive orders, memoranda of agreement or understanding
- New or revised local coastal programs and implementing ordinances



Program Changes

- New or revised coastal land acquisition, management, and restoration programs
- New or revised Special Area Management Plans or plans for Areas of Particular Concern
- New or revised guidelines, procedures and policy documents which are formally adopted by a state
