Background – Federal Requirements

- 1996 Amendments to the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act
 - Program in place by October, 2002 EPA Guidelines published February, 1999
- Annual Review
 - Loss of 20% of the State Revolving Loan Fund -- \$7.4 million in 2010
- Current Status of Program

Background – State Requirements

- Drinking Water and Wastewater Systems Operator Certification Act
 - Applies federal standards to wastewater treatment system operators
 - Criminal history check
 - Security training
- Signed February 21, 2002
- Program implementation through interim regulations (Technical Guidance #383-2300-001)& guidelines

Public Comment Period

- **Proposed Rulemaking**
 - July 11 through September 9, 2009
 - Received 154 comments from 77 commentators
- **ANFR**
 - January 23 through February 26, 2010
 - Received 54 comments from 13 commentators

"Banking" of Credits

- EPA Regions interpret guidelines differently
- Data management and staffing issues
- Outstanding issues and questions
- Proposal
 - Solicit input from the regulated community
 - Final recommendation to the EQB within three years

Fees & Compliance Costs



- Fee Structure based on premise that “everyone should pay” ...
- Operators
 - Average cost to get certified ... **\$235**
 - Average cost to maintain license ... **\$360**
- Owners
 - Costs depend on the number of systems owned
 - Maximum cost is **\$10,000** for any one owner
- Training Providers/Examination Providers
 - Examination Provider Average ... **\$600**
 - Costs to the Training Provider depend on number of courses
 - Maximum cost is **\$10,000** for any one provider

Comments Requested

- Reciprocity
 - General Examination vs Comprehensive

- Begin collection of fees to support program
- Resume services put on hold last year due to budget issues as quickly as possible
