Program Background

- Dam Safety
 - 3,346 regulated dams
 - 646 dams affected by new regulations
- Water Obstruction & Encroachment (WO&E)
 - 517 WO&E permits
 - 3,428 General Permits (GPs)
 - 338 acres of streams disturbed
 - 100 acres of wetlands disturbed
- Submerged Lands License Agreement (SLLAs)
 - ->39 million square feet leased



Process to Develop New Fees

- 1. Workload Analysis
- 2. Cost to Operate Programs
- 3. Fee Increases and Development
 - SLLA charge increases
- 4. Revenue Estimate



Purpose of Revisions

- Update existing fees and charges
 - The charges for SLLAs have not increased since 1978
 - The fees for most permitting activities have not increased since 1991
- Develop additional fees for permit related activities
- Fees collected will offset a portion of the operating costs of the programs



Rulemaking Timetable

- EQB Approved Proposed Rulemaking December 21, 2010
- Proposed Rulemaking Published in *Pennsylvania Bulletin* January 28, 2012
- Public Comment Period Expired February 27, 2012
- IRRC Comment Deadline Expired March 28, 2012
- 30 Commentators



Key Comments and Concerns

- Exemption of state, county, municipal agencies
- Federal agencies are exempt from the fees by statute
- Ensure the solvency and fiduciary health of its municipalities
- Privately-owned dams are not disproportionally carrying the costs of program administration



Key Comments and Concerns

- Annual fees based upon hazard potential category of the dam
- Need for DEP to conduct annual dam inspections
- The rulemaking has been in development and discussed publicly by DEP since 2010



Revisions from Proposed to Final

- Proposed rule inadvertently charged dredging operations fees in addition to royalty payments
- DEP has added 105.13(c)(2)(iii)(B) to clarify

Dam Safety regulations vary greatly across the United States as indicated in the table below.

Summary – Dam Safety

- Cost to Administer = \$3,287,132
- Estimated Revenue = \$1,139,850
 Difference = \$2,147,282
 - 35% of Dam Safety costs will be offset
- Exemptions Remain for State, County, Municipal Agencies and Authorities
- Restricted Revenue Account
- 3 Year Review



Final Rulemaking – WO&E

105.13(c)(2) Regulated activities – information and fees

- WO&E Permit Activities
 - Current range \$100 \$750
 - Final range \$100 \$1,750
 - Additional disturbance fee to some activities
 - \$400 / 0.1 acre temporary
 - \$800 / 0.1 acre permanent



Final Rulemaking – WO&E

105.13(c)(2) Regulated activities – information and fees

- General Permits (GPs)
 - Currently no fees
 - Final range \$50 \$750
 - -Additional disturbance fee to some activities
- Current fee exemptions will remain



Final Rulemaking – SLLAs

105.35 Charges for use and occupation of submerged lands of this Commonwealth.

- Annual Charges
 - Currently ~ \$0.01/square foot average
 - Commercial Utilities per tenth acre, \$250 minimum
 - Private Recreational Docks \$250
 - Public Service Lines per foot within a range
 - Final ~ \$0.04/square foot average
 - Private Recreational Docks remain \$250

Summary – WO&E and SLLA

- Cost to Administer = \$9,615,470
- Estimated Revenue = \$2,952,612
 - Difference = \$6,662,858
 - 31% of WO&E costs will be offset
- SLLA Program
 - Cost to administer is embedded in WO&E costs
 - Estimated Revenue = \$1,564,000

-All revenue deposited into the General Fund

- All exemptions remain
- Restricted Revenue Account
- 3 Year Review
