# Regulatory Requirements

- Chapter 302, Administration of the Water and Wastewater Systems Operators' Certification Program, was published as a final rulemaking on September 18, 2010.
- 25 Pa. Code § 302.202: "The Department will review the adequacy of the fees established in this section at least once **every 3 years** and provide a written report to the EQB."



# Fee Review Historical Summary

- Today will mark the third occasion the Department presented a fee report to EQB since Chapter 302 was published.

   Board reviewed and commented on the fee report presented today.
- Proposal to EQB Today: No modification of fees.




#### Licenses 2011-2019




## More Operator Exam Opportunities

- Every year from 2013 through 2019 the number of examination seats offered significantly exceeded the number of exam seats filled.
- More specifically, during this seven-year period:
  - 16,216 total exam seats offered
  - 12,050 total exam seats filled

  - a. Complement will remain at existing levels and staff will continue to carry out duties under the Operator Certification program.
  - b. A standard inflationary increase of 3% per year is applied to personnel and operating expenses.
- <sup>3</sup> IT services are provided through DEP's enterprise contractor and include support and enhancements to eFACTS and the Earthwise Academy operator transcript and continuing education catalog system. Adept Consulting, Inc. is currently DEP's enterprise contractor.



## Revenue vs Expense Trend Analysis

Table 4. Revenue/Expense Ratios for the Operator Certification Program

|       | FY '16-17 | FY '17-18 | FY '18-19 | FY '19-20 | FY '20-21 | FY '21-22 |

- The projected revenue/expense ratios indicate that the current fee schedule established in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 302 should cover most Operator Certification program costs for the next three fiscal years.
- Reduced Expenses in FY 18-19 were a result of a staffing vacancy which was filled in FY 19-20.
- Surplus revenues from previous fiscal years will cover actual shortfalls that may occur in FY '20 through FY '22.



## Certification Board Review and Comment

Minutes from the August 12, 2020 meeting of the State Board for Certification of Water and Wastewater Systems Operators:

"The Board voted that the report content was complete and agreed with the Department's recommendation to keep the existing fee structure for the next three fiscal years."



## **DEP Recommendation**

 After careful consideration of available information, DEP plans to retain the current fees in Chapter 302.

• The next fee review and cost analysis report should occur in fourth quarter of 2022, with results and recommendations presented to the EQB in 2023.









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
