Robert Page (DEP) conducted a Chapter 102 inspection of this industrial redevelopment site (reference previous Chapter 102 inspections between July 18 and November 21, 2024) during an active rain event. No permittee representatives were present; I did not enter the site and took all pictures and observations from 51st Street and the Bartram's Garden trail. I noted that the filter sock along the most upslope gate to the site was in proper position and in good operating condition. The filter sock along the more downslope gate was not replaced to proper position after the gate had been last closed. I saw that parts of the security chain-link fence along 51st St. were damaged. Significant puddling was noted on the flat area in the middle and downslope portion of the site. Some minor germination continued to be present on the large fill dirt stockpile. Describe: **COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE RECOMMENDATIONS** 1. Significant erosion gullies remain on the large fill dirt stockpile. To maintain compliance with 25 Pa. Code, Section 102.22(b), addressing and maintaining the temporary stabilization of the large fill dirt stockpile is recommended. 2. In accordance with DEP's Erosion and Sediment Pollution Control Program Manual, Technical Guidance No. 363-2134-008 (March 2012), Page 65, inspect filter socks weekly and after each runoff event. In addition, DEP requests that damaged socks be repaired according to manufacturer's specifications or replaced within 24 hours of inspection. 3. Ensure that filter socks are re-placed into proper position at the gates along 51st St. after vehicles leave the site. 3. Repair of the security fence along 51st St. is recommended.

The erosion gullies first noted on the large fill dirt stockpile (first described in Report No. 10, 10/22/24), remained present. Failure of temporary stabilization to minimize accelerated erosion and sedimentation is a violation of 25 Pa. Code, Section 102.22(b).

The black tarp covering the small pile of contaminated soil downslope of the large fill dirt stockpile was re-placed to its proper position since the last inspection on 11/21/24. Perimeter control (filter sock) around this pile, and the downslope site perimeter, remained intact.

I noted that stormwater discharge from the site, as seen just downslope of the silt fences, where previous sediment staining is present on the trail, appeared to be clear during today's inspection.

Inlet protection socks along the wall separating the Bartram's Garden trail, as present during previous inspections, were not present during this inspection.

A plume of yellowish sediment discharge was present in the stormwater at the lowest point of the Bartram's Garden trail, as seen in the photo log accompanying this inspection report. I traced this plume to originate from the embankment of ballast stone for the train tracks. Stormwater from the site appeared to enter drain inlets in the wall upslope (to the north) of the location of the active plume.


