




## The Operator's Struggle



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### How?

- Better System Management
- Principals of Sustainable Infrastructure
- Proactive Approach
- Know what is contained in your permit as well as applicable laws and regulations
- Effective Process Control
- Effective Communication with System Owners, Regulatory Agencies & Customers



#### Details on Process Control and System Management

- Operators are not firemen. They are fire prevention experts.
- Routinely communicate operator and facility needs and follow-up.
- Can't operate efficiently unless adequate process control parameters are assessed.
- Job is not to produce compliant DMRs. (falsify data) Violations at a properly operated plant may be the result of I/I, inadequate design, improper sewer use, etc. These should be addressed, not covered up.

#### Laws, Rules and Regulations

- Federal Laws (US EPA & others)
- State Laws (PA DEP & others)
- Regulations (both state and federal)

# **PERMITS issued to your facility**

#### Read and Understand your permits!

- Owners are required to provide a copy of permits to operators. Get a copy of permits impacting your system.
- Permits describe the terms and conditions you must meet to:
- Properly operate your facility.
- Ensure compliance with laws, rules and regulations impacting your facility

If there are any terms or conditions in your permit(s) that you do not understand, ASK!

### Non Compliance

#### **Civil vs. Criminal Action**

- Most environmental laws provide for civil and/or criminal penalties for non-compliance (loss of license, jail time, fines)
- In most cases, regulatory agencies use *civil* proceedings to achieve compliance such as:
  - Inspection Reports
  - NOV's
  - Orders and Consent Orders of Agreement
  - Administrative Conferences
  - Assessment of Penalties
- *Criminal* prosecution is likely in cases of willful or intentional acts of non-compliance, especially those that involve fraud or endangerment of public health and the environment but also may result from acts of gross negligence.

#### **Reviewing Non Compliance**

- The Severity of the Violation?
- Duration of the Violation?
- Environmental Damage?
- Endangering Public Health?
- Historical Performance (frequency of violation)?
- The Compliance Scale
  - Accidental
  - Negligent
  - Willful
  - Intentional





### **Enforcement Actions**

- Inspection Report
- NOV = Cop Pulling You Over
  - Written warning
  - Issues a ticket with a fine
  - Wake up call
- Order (Consent or Not)
  - To individual or permittee
  - Time frames for compliance
  - Possible Penalties
    - Clean Streams Law, Safe Drinking Water Act or Clean Water Act
- Petition Board
  - Op Cert Act
  - For such things as:
    - Falsification of Records
    - Illegal Dumping
    - Deliberate Violation of Regulations
