3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

DANGER

Corrosive. May cause tissue damage. Flammable. Toxic by inhalation, in contact with skin and if swallowed. Contains methanol. Methanol may cause central nervous system effects or permanent vision damage if inhaled, swallowed or absorbed through the skin in large amounts. This product contains naphthalene. The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has evaluated naphthalene and determined it to be possibly carcinogenic to humans (Group 2B, based on sufficient evidence in experimental animals and inadequate evidence in humans). Keep container tightly closed. Keep away from heat. Keep away from sources of ignition - No smoking. Do not get in eyes, on skin, on clothing. Do not take internally. Use with adequate ventilation. Avoid breathing vapor. If respiratory symptoms develop, remove to fresh air, rest, treat symptomatically. Get medical attention. In case of contact with eyes, rinse immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice. After contact with skin, wash immediately with

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plenty of water. Use a mild soap if available.

Wear a face shield. Wear chemical resistant apron, chemical splash goggles, impervious gloves and boots.

HUMAN HEALTH HAZARDS - ACUTE :

EYE CONTACT :

Corrosive. Will cause eye burns and permanent tissue damage.

SKIN CONTACT :

Corrosive; causes permanent skin damage. Harmful in contact with skin. Methanol may be absorbed through the skin and cause central nervous system effects which may result in permanent visual changes including blindness.

INGESTION :

Corrosive; causes chemical burns to the mouth, throat and stomach. Toxic if swallowed. The main hazard of methyl alcohol arises from its misuse as a drinking substitute for ethyl alcohol. As little as 15 ml of 40% methyl alcohol may cause death. Sublethal doses may cause central nervous system effects and may result in permanent visual changes including blindness.

INHALATION :

Elevated temperatures or mechanical action may form vapors, mists or fumes which may be irritating to the eyes, nose, throat and lungs. Toxic by inhalation.

AGGRAVATION OF EXISTING CONDITIONS :

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYE CONTACT :

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS :

Restrict access to area as appropriate until clean-up operations are complete. Use personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 (Exposure Controls/Personal Protection). Stop or reduce any leaks if it is safe to do so. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Ventilate spill area if possible. Remove sources of ignition. Ensure clean-up is conducted by trained personnel only. Do not touch spilled material. Have emergency equipment (for fires, spills, leaks, etc.) readily available. Notify appropriate government, occupational health and safety and environmental authorities.

METHODS FOR CLEANING UP :

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7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

HANDLING :

ENGINEERING MEASURES :
